Most likely you know a person with a hearing loss.
They are EVERYWHERE 😊

You probably have spoken to them.
You probably have seen them.
You probably have met them.
You probably know someone in your family.
You probably go to school with someone.

In a group picture, you would not be able to pick out a person with a hearing loss. Hearing loss is invisible!

Some people with hearing loss talk well.
Some people sound different when they talk.
Some people do not talk at all.

Some people with a hearing loss use sign language. Some use the hearing they have and clues they can see to understand you.

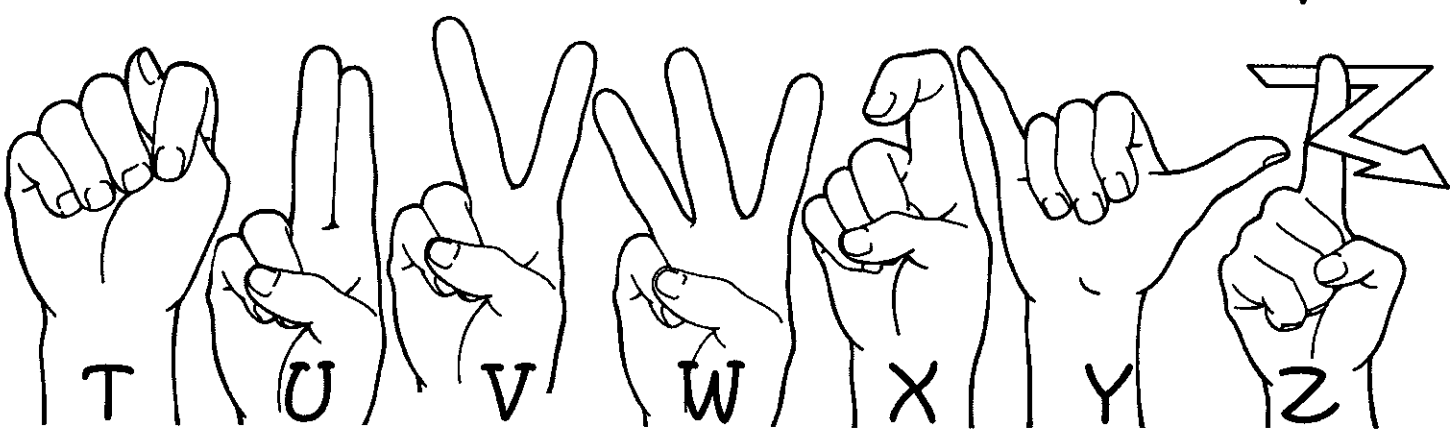
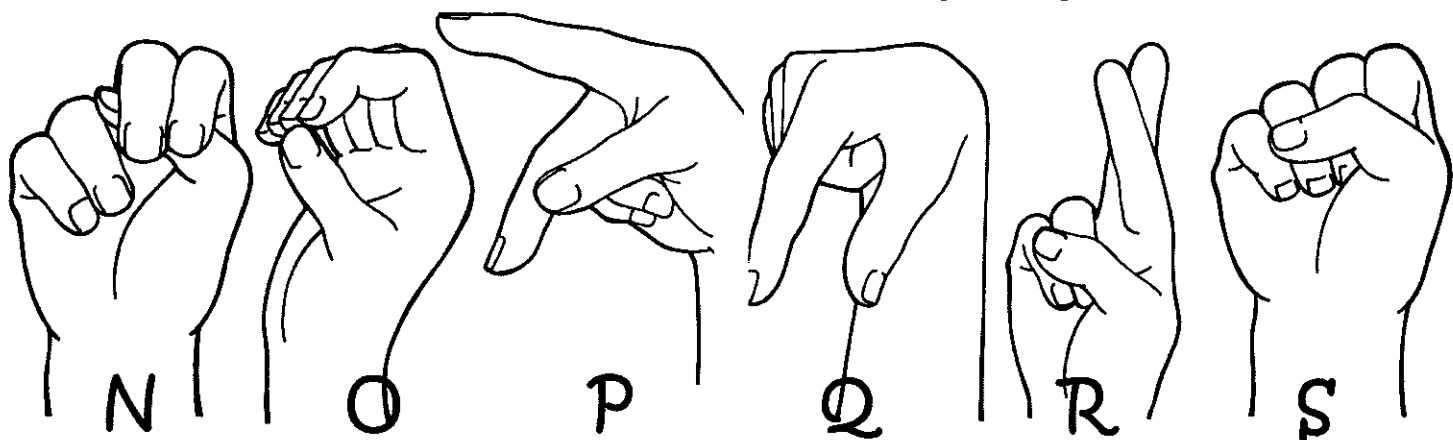
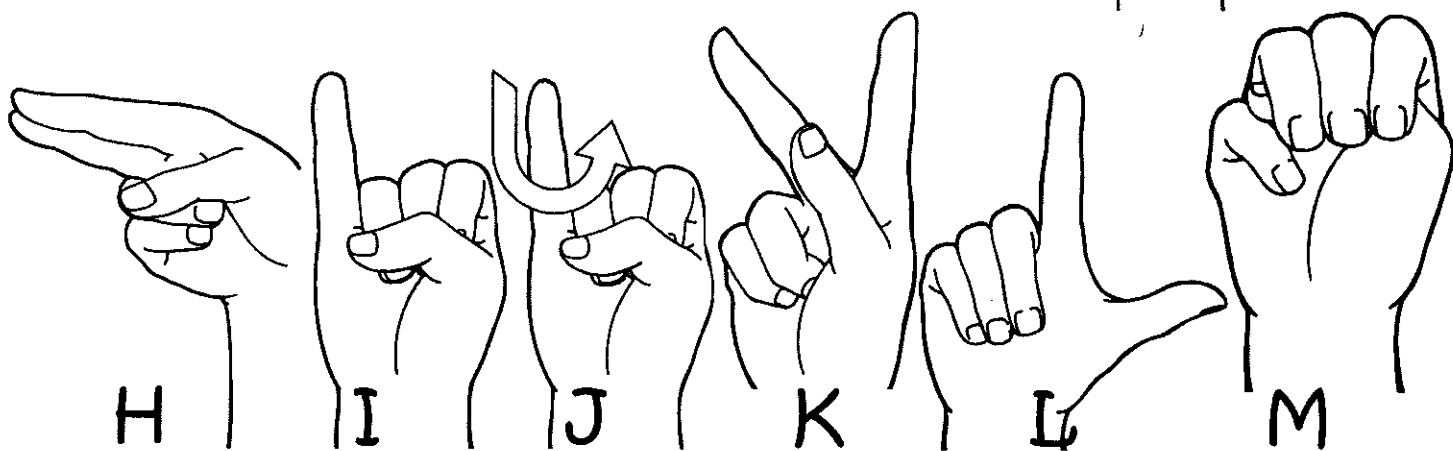
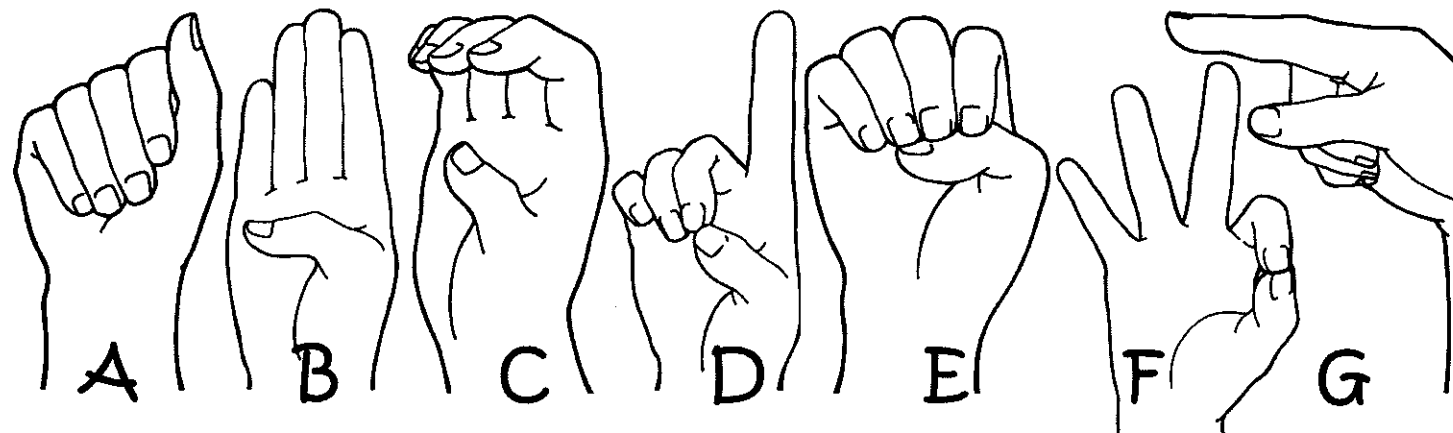
If you want to talk to a person who is deaf or hard of hearing, don't be afraid to...

HINT: Like a butterfly's wings fluttering.



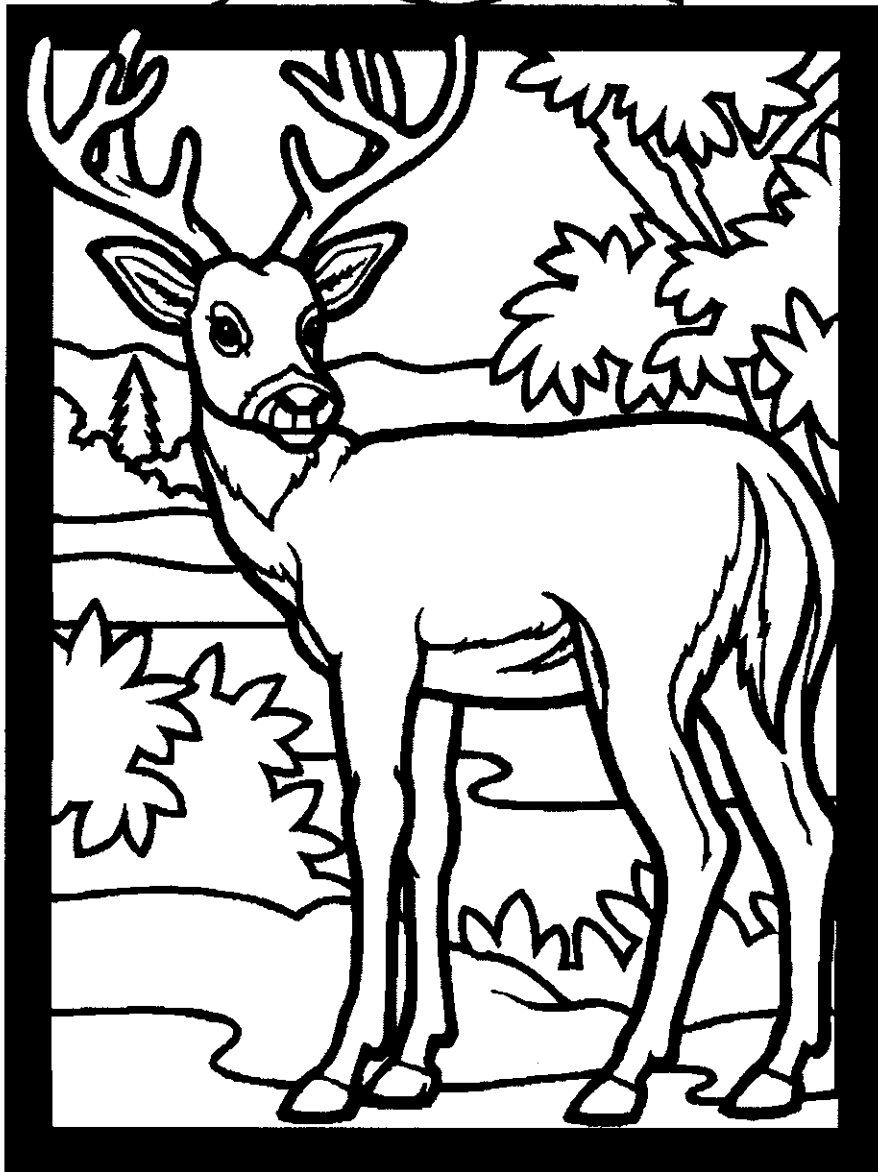
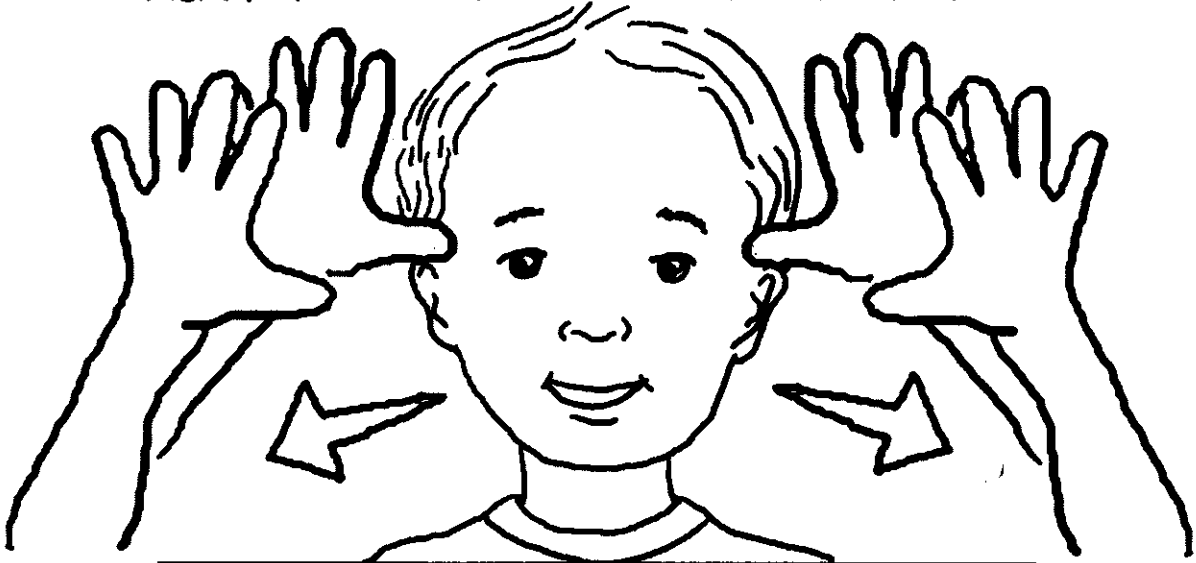
Cow

HINT: Stick out your little finger like a cow's horn and move it up and down.



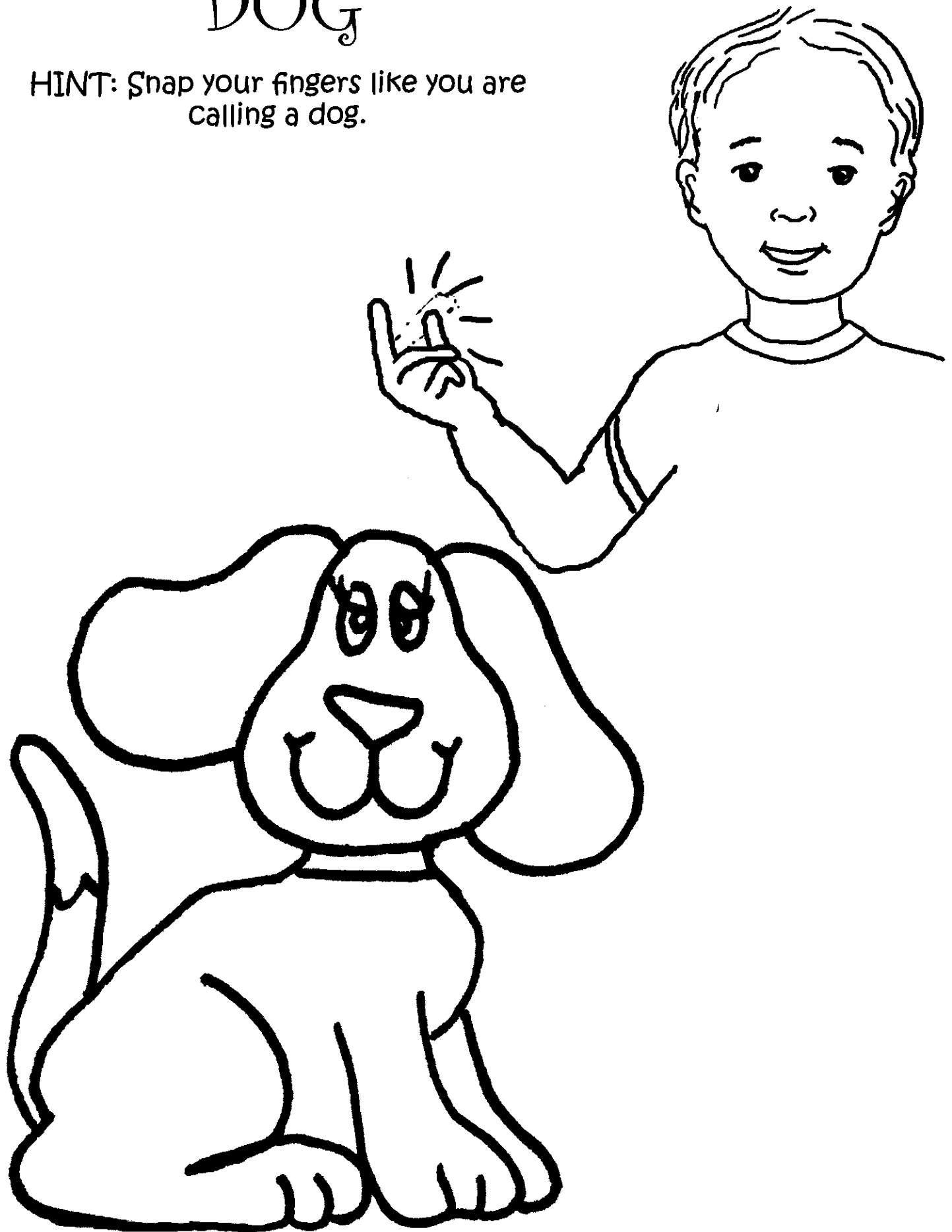
DEER

HINT: Snap your fingers like you are calling a dog.



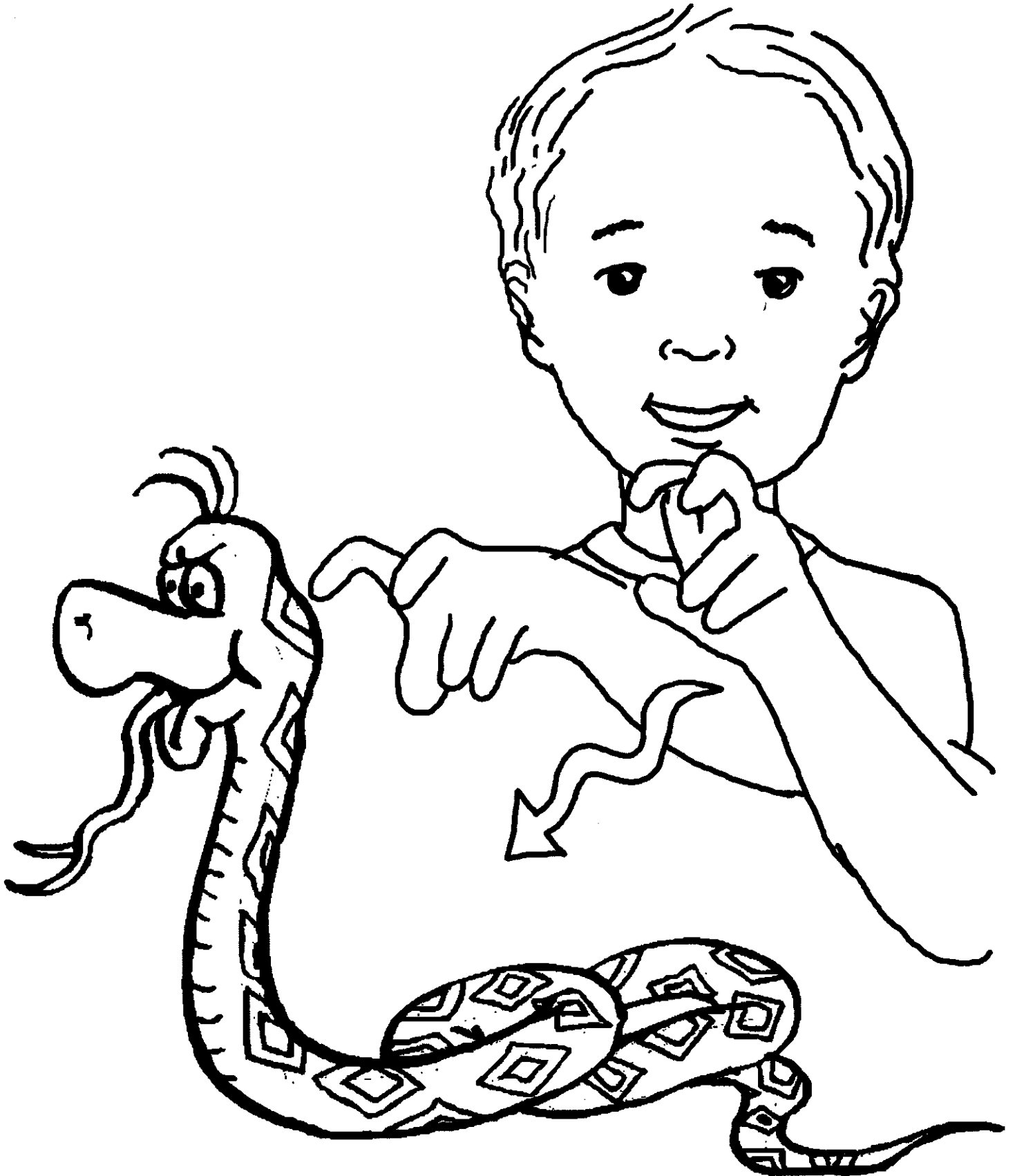
Raccoon

HINT: Trace your eye like a mask.



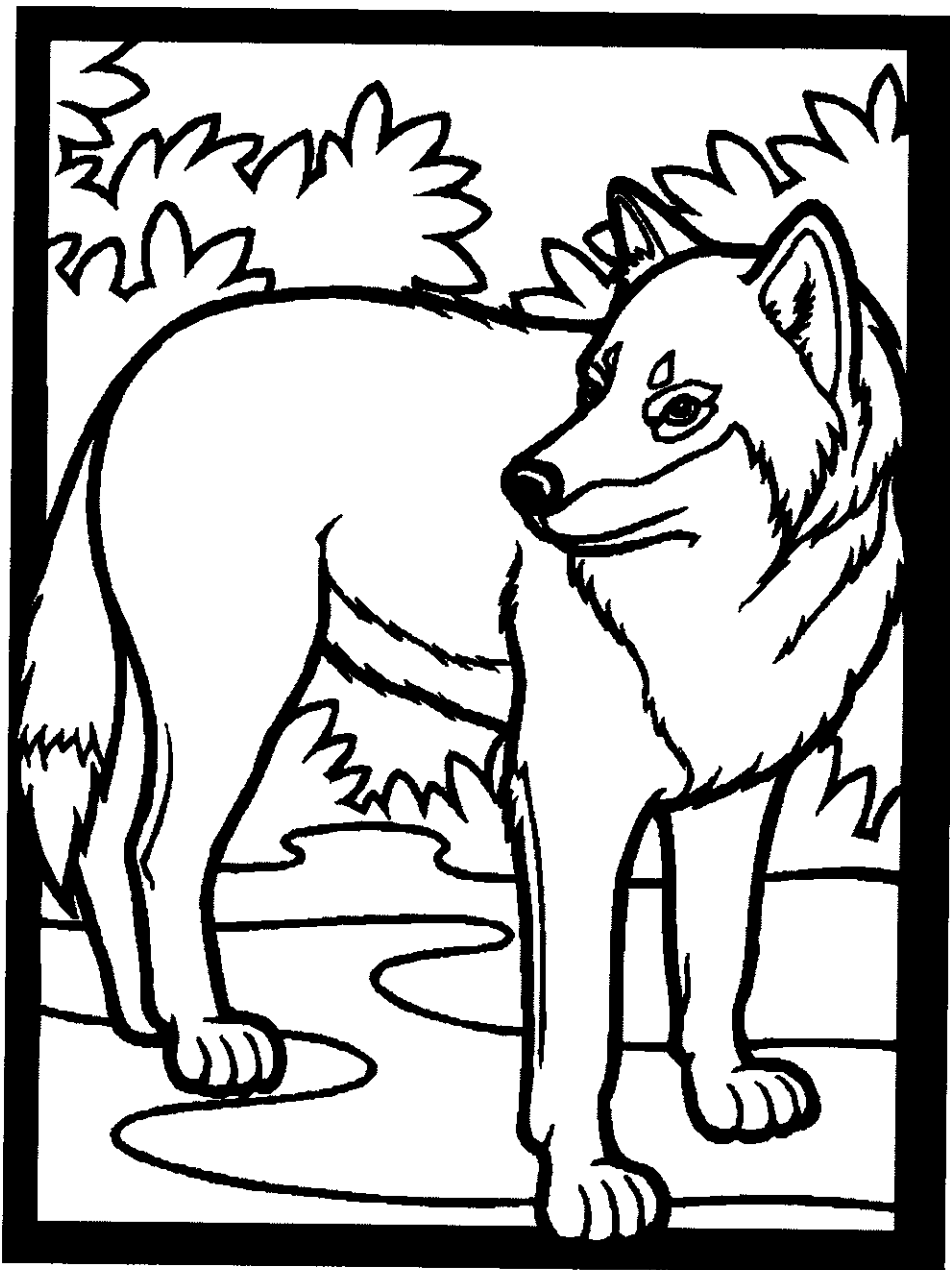
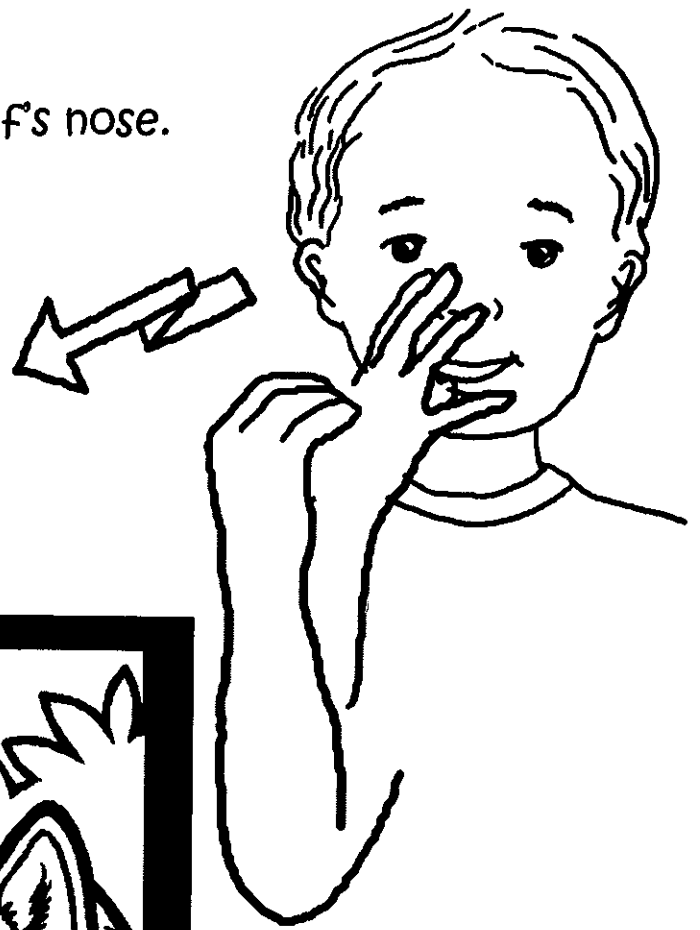

HINT: Pretend your fingers are the snake's fangs.



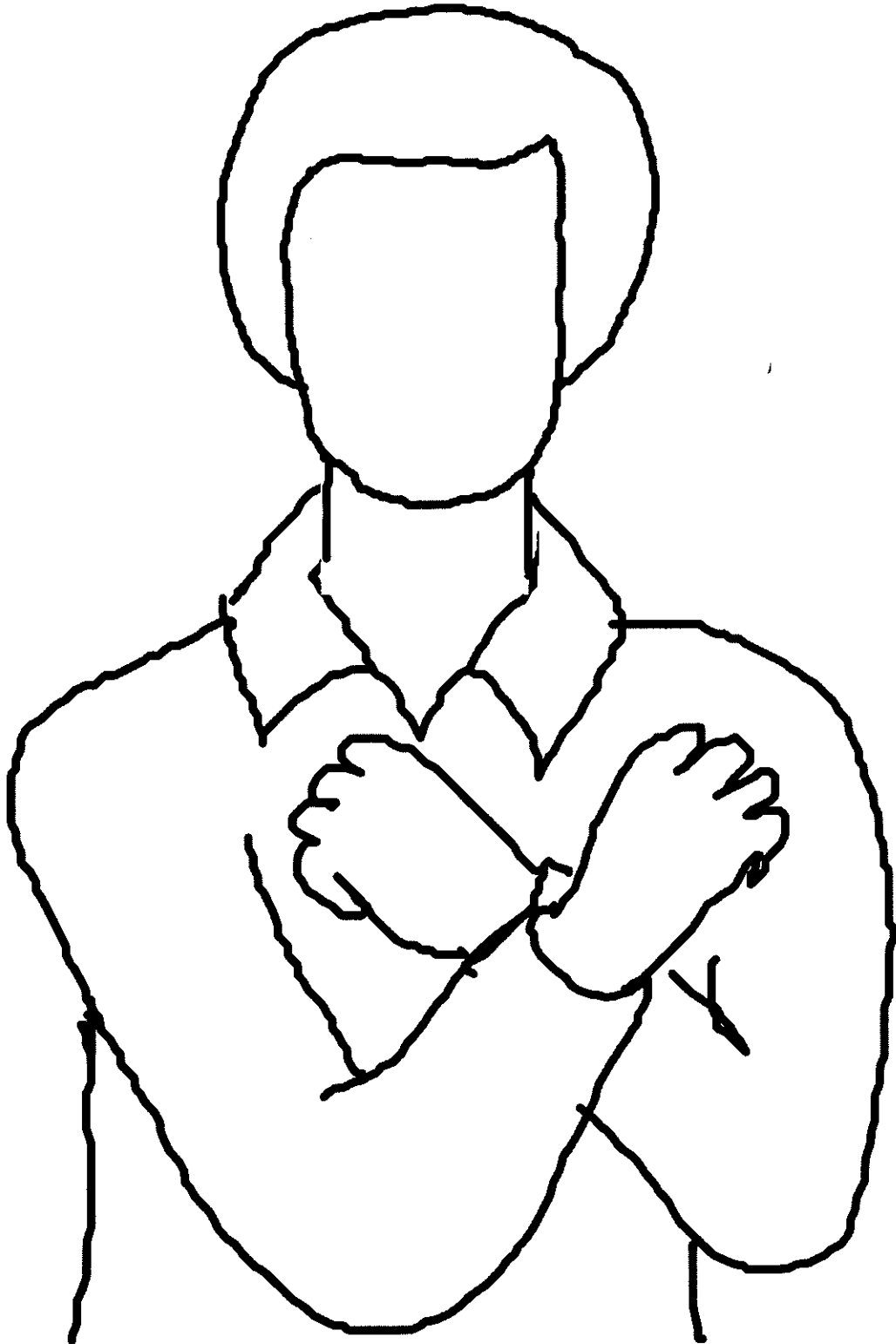
